## WHAT I RESEARCH

---

How do cities become not just rich, but also sexy? This question of the **global cultural capital** of cities is at the heart of my research. I examine how cities mobilise **global events** such as the Olympic Games and **global buildings** such as cultural flagships (museums, concert halls etc.) to this end.

Committed to bringing in places and voices outside mainstream Western conversations in English, I think with and through a concept I call the **Global Easts**: all those spaces that fall between the cracks of a world divided into North and South but that help us think beyond that binary divide.

## HOW I CONTRIBUTE TO KNOWLEDGE

---

- 1) Conceptualised the **Global Easts** as a thinking space beyond the hemispheric binary of North and South (Müller 2020, Geopolitics)
- 2) Addressed **language and linguistic privilege** as a crucial but often forgotten aspect of difference and uneven power relations, next to gender, class, race, sexuality and others (Müller 2021, Progress in Human Geography)
- 3) Opened up **assemblage thinking** to **actor-network theory** (Müller & Schurr 2016, Transactions)
- 4) Reshaped how we think about what **mega-events** are (Müller 2015, Leisure Studies), what impacts they have on cities (Müller 2015, Journal of the American Planning Association), how (un)sustainable they are (Müller et al. 2021, Nature Sustainability) and how we have reached 'peak event' (Müller et al. forthcoming)
